AFFIDAVIT OF THE MASTER OR COMMANDING OFFICER, OR FIRST OR SECOND OFFICER

I, Alfred Nelson, "Master of the SS Pennland, from Liverpool, do solemnly, sincerely, and truly swear that I have made a personal examination of each and all of the passengers, 29 and that I have caused the Surgeon of said vessel, sailing therewith, or the Surgeon employed by the owners thereof, to make a physical examination of each of said passengers, and that, from my own or the Surgeon's examination, or from the Surgeon's report, I believe that no passenger is a pauper or a person suffering from any contagious disease, or a person who has been convicted of a felony or other infamous crime or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or is a fugitive, or is under a contract or agreement to perform labor in the United States, except such as are expressly exempted under the law. And that, solely to the best of my knowledge and belief, the information set forth in the List or Manifest, concerning each of said passengers named therein, is correct and true.
